

GALIEN INTERNATIONAL AWARDS

REGULATIONS

Article 1. - The Galien International Awards for Pharmaceutical Research is organized every two years by one of the member countries of the Prix Galien Awards.

Article 2. - Recently marketed drugs that have been granted a national award are eligible to compete in the Galien International Awards. Candidate drugs must in principle be available on the markets of all the countries participating in the Galien International Awards, particularly in the organizing country. If a candidate drug is not yet marketed in the organizing country, the latter reserves the right to request that a country where the selected molecule is marketed host the Galien International Award in its stead. Drugs that do not receive an award may be resubmitted for a future Galien International Award.

Article 3. The organizing country draws up an agenda in collaboration with the Permanent Secretary General who is in charge of dispatching the information to all Prix Galien partners. The Galien partners concerned by the same molecule must submit a common entry. Entries must be submitted in English, and if possible in French, with a short resume of one or two pages.

Article 4. - The deliberation of the jury and the Galien International Awards Ceremony will take place in a city chosen by the organizing country.

Article 5. - The organization and logistics of the International Galien Award are the responsibility of the host country.

Article 6. - Medals, signs, logos, and all information and promotional material related to the Prix Galien are a registered trademark protected by French and International law.

Article 7. – The use of the Prix Galien trademark must comply with the Prix Galien rules.
